

U.S. English 2008 Voter Information Guide



The U.S. English, Inc. 2008 Voter Information Guide provides a complete picture on how candidates for the U.S. House and U.S. Senate stand on making English the official language of the United States.

Incumbents have been graded based on their recent voting records in Congress (2006-2008) and for returning a pledge promising to support official English legislation if re-elected to Congress. Opponents have been rated for returning a pledge promising to support official English legislation if elected to the upcoming Congress. Candidates with a demonstrated record of supporting official English legislation have been marked as “U.S. English Approved.”

In no way does “U.S. English Approved” endorse a specific candidate or candidates. In some districts, both candidates are “U.S. English Approved.” In other districts, neither candidate is.

A blank in the “incumbent” column indicates that the current member of Congress is not running for re-election. A blank in the “opponent” column indicates that the incumbent member faces no major party opposition in November.
